

# 2008-09 No Banner Year Either

During the 2007-08 academic year, USMNEWS.net staff followed the progress of USM's athletics teams in order to assess USM president Martha Saunders' Fall 2007 Convocation claim that Golden Eagles sports teams would be producing a "banner year" in 2007-08. The report that ultimately emerged from that assignment, "Aunt Martha's 'Banner Year'," is inserted below. As you can see, the Golden Eagles sports units won only 51.6% of their contests (i.e., 239 wins in 463 contests) during 2007-08, a result representing anything *but* a "banner year."

## Aunt Martha's "Banner Year"

USM President, Martha Saunders, stood before USM faculty, staff and students, along with local media, at the University's Fall 2007 Convocation and proclaimed that USM's athletics would be producing a banner year during 2007-08. How did Saunders' proclamation stand up to the test of time? If Table 1 below is any indication, not so well.

As the data above indicate, only USM's football and baseball teams finished their seasons after participating in a top-level national format/tournament. Overall, USM's sports programs won only 239 of their 463 outings during the 2007-08 academic year. This is certainly not a "banner year" by any stretch of the imagination.

Saunders' USM blog told the world that she (Saunders) hired the coach who led the University of Wisconsin at Whitewater to the Division 3 national championship in 2007. Maybe USM fans should give her a chance to replace each current USM coach before complaining about the banner year of 2007-08.

As a follow-up to last year's report, and perhaps to serve as a check-up, USMNEWS.net staff has been following Golden Eagles athletics teams during 2008-09. The results, at least thus far, are shown in Table 1 below.

Table 1 above indicates that the 2008-09 version (collective) of the Golden Eagles performed worse than the 2007-08 version did - losing *8 more* contests (232, counting the 4 ties, to 224) over *12 fewer* total athletic events - despite Corky Palmer's baseball team's successful runs through the Atlanta Regional and Gainesville Super Regional, resulting in USM's first-ever appearance in the College World Series, to end the 2008-09 sports season. Not only has there not been any noticeable improvement overall, some are saying that Larry Eustachy's job as head men's basketball coach is on the chopping block. Given the obvious lack of performance shown above, the Saunders administration should be thinking hard about how athletics can contribute to USM's budget cuts in 2009-10.
