## **Been That Long?**

The recent reprinting (on 2-Nov-09) of some older USMNEWS reports about the so-called "Black Tuesday" in the EFIB reminded CoBers and other readers of USMNEWS.net that the website has been around for quite some time. The aforementioned report was dated Sept-06, making it more than three years old. The website is, in fact, much older than that. The first reports rolled off the presses back in the winter/spring of 2006, earlier that same year.

It was also then that Carter informed the world that current CoB assistant professor of ECO, Yosef Bonaparte, was fired (during 2008-09) without warning or cause.

This brings us back to "Black Tuesday" of Sept-06. Carter was at the heart of that episode – one of the more dastardly in modern CoB history. It's funny how a 2006 subterfuge can be something else to the same person who in 2009 threw the term around so loosely in describing other events.
