Does President Saunders Need a Larger Plane?

One of the greatest scrolls in the history of USMNEWS.net occurred on 16-Sept-2010, announcing all of the individuals who traveled with USM president Martha Saunders aboard "USM air" to Omaha, Nebraska, in June of 2009 for a USM baseball game. A facsimile of that scroll, containing a partial list of the passengers for that trip, appears below. The names run from Saunders to Chad and Jack Driskell, Joe Bailey, Doug Rouse, Joe and Connie Morgan, Bob Pierce, Johnny Atherton, Jay McDowell, Billy Hewes, Richard Giannini, Johnny Dupree and John Brown. If you're counting, that's 14 passengers – so many the pilots (yes, both of them) had to make two trips from Mississippi to Nebraska to get them all to the game. USMNEWS.net estimates that the entire episode cost Mississippi taxpayers more than \$72,000. Again, if you're counting, that's probably the salary of Mark Clark, the Greek and Latin professor Saunders "canned" back on 1-Sept-2010.

The linked report indicates that Joe Bailey is Saunders' husband, and that Johnny Dupree was, and still is, the Hattiesburg mayor. Joe Morgan is, of course, the former USM chief financial officer who resigned under a cloud just a few weeks ago. He was demoted to a position with alumni affairs, though Saunders allowed him to retain his hefty CFO salary, even though religion professor Daniel Capper had to be fired recently in order to allow the university to survive.

John Brown is a staffer in the mayor's office, though he formerly reported for WDAM-TV News for quite awhile. One would guess he did a story or two on misuse of tax dollars by public officials during his time there. Giannini was, and still is, USM's athletics director. Again, he should have traveled with the team to Omaha, not with Saunders. Rouse is a local doctor who also serves on the Mississippi IHL Board. Is he independent in that role?
