Updated, See Below Misery

The student athletes on the USM women's basketball team have earned PhDs in heartache and disappointment. Their major professor is head coach Joye Lee-McNelis. The fan base, a largely older, yet loyal population of Hattiesburg citizens that was cultivated by former head coach Kay James, has long since melted away. Now, echoes of crickets are all that can be heard inside Reed Green Coliseum on game days. There's hittle wonder as to why all of this is occurring. Lee-McNelis began her USM career in 2004-05, going 9-19 (0.321) that first season. The last two years, her sixth and seventh, saw her lady cagers go 9-21 (0.300) and 10-20 (0.333), respectively. Things were supposed to get better, not worse. As it stands, the group of juniors on this year's roster were only 19-41 (0.317) going into their third season, or Lee-McNelis' eighth, in the 'Burg. Heading into the 26-Jan-2012 game against UTEP, the Lady Eagles juniors are only 6-13 (0.316) on the 2011-12 season, and thus 25-54 (0.316) over their USM careers.

There are many shameful pieces to this chapter in Eagle athletics history. For one, former USM softball coach Howard Dobson was run out of town on a rail in 2011 after going 93-124-2 (0.429) – a mark that is 2.4 percentage points better than Lee-McNelis' most recent four seasons (her fifth- eighth) – after just four seasons in the Hub City. Lee-McNelis has had eight. Even worse, Scott Berry, the head baseball coach who has gone 75-43 (0.636) over his first two seasons in 2010-11 – a mark that is 32 percentage points better than Lee-McNelis' most recent four – is earning a whopping \$43,000 less than Lee-McNelis, a troublesome situation chastised by famed Mississippi sportswriter Rick Cleveland in April-2011. To think that it took a \$22,600 raise to get Berry this close only makes it worse. So much for *winning* the 2010 C-USA baseball title. Finally, to top all this off, Lee-McNelis resorted to committing NCAA violations in 2010, a move that sent the NCAA to town and resulted in a one-game suspension for the head coach.

It's clearly time for Lee-McNelis to pack her bags and exit the USM athletics department. The details above make more than a sufficient case for such to occur. Oh, by the way, Lee-McNelis' Lady Eagles were just defeated by UTEP, and are now 6-14 (0.300) on the 2011-12 season. Lee-McNelis' tenure already includes the three worst seasons at USM since 1977. Her current 2011-12 record matches the worst of these three. It looks like another record-setting year will be added to Lee-McNelis' resume.

Updated, 31-Jan-2012

Between the time that this column was penned and when it was published, the Lady Eagles lost yet another game – on the road against UAB. That loss dropped the team's record to a dismal 6-15 (0.286). If the 2011-12 season ends with this mark, head coach Joye Lee-McNelis will have produced her worst season in 8 years at USM. Odds are that the record will be even worse by the time that the season ends. The loss to UAB also drops Lee-McNelis record since 2009-10 to 25-56 (0.309). The misery continues.
