Skip Hughes' Trap

The USMNEWS.net audio library received some new volumes recently. These came courtesy of new accounting director, Kirby E. "Skip" Hughes. I fully expect these volumes to be checked out regularly by USMNEWS.net reporters. They are full of juicy bits, and ones that will surely put more light on the administrative deficiencies that have been hounding USM for years and years.
