## The Ghosts of Christmas Present

If you've been keeping track of all of the nonsense occurring almost daily at USM, you probably can't help but think that the campus is caught in the grip of some type of *inaction specter*. Take, for example, Daniel Miles' <u>neat proposal</u> to shift one-half of each student's tuition-tax payment to support USM athletics into academic affairs. Over the course of the year, this will shift about \$3 million from sports to education.
