Crockett is Back?

Stories are now spreading around the CoB suggesting that former SAIS Director James Crockett has been hired by the CoB as a consultant. To that you ask: For what? To write the AACSB reaffirmation report for the School of Accountancy and Information Systems. It seems that Roderick Posey, the most recent SAIS Director to give up the position, couldn't get the job done.
