## Another Million

The Asbury Foundation has just given William Carey University, USM's cross-town academic rival, another \$1 million donation. According to Ed Kemp's <u>article</u> in *The Hattiesburg American*, the AF has now given WCU \$2.4 million since 1984. This gift essentially puts WCU on par with USM's recent \$6 million gift from the anonymous donor who supported a number of female-led American universities a few months ago. According to USM officials, about \$5 million of that gift will go to student scholarships. King told Kemp that Blue Cross/Blue Shield had just given the SoOM a \$100,000 donation, and that the new school had just received two anonymous pledges totaling \$200,000. If we're being real, and knowing the history of higher ed in MS, doesn't that sound better than some unsubstantiated and harmless claim about being the "research leader for the Gulf South?"
