Another \$17,000 for USM's Administration

HATTIESBURG – At its 17-March-2011 meeting, the Mississippi IHL approved a \$17,000 raise for Ann Parker Blackwell (pictured below), the interim dean of USM's College of Education & Psychology. The 12.6% raise, which takes Blackwell's salary from \$135,000 to \$152,000, is part of USM president Martha Saunders' decision, announced on 3-March-2011 via David Tisdale's USM presser, to remove the "interim" part of Blackwell's title.



The decision to elevate Blackwell's title and salary continues a trend by the Saunders administration to favor, during hard economic times, USM <u>administrators</u> over USM's rank-and-file faculty. Recent <u>beneficiaries</u> of <u>this program</u> include new USM vice president for administrative affair Russ Willis (twice), <u>and new</u> USM administrators Elizabeth Payne and Jonathan Williams. Sources say that the Saunders administration's decisions vis-à-vis administrators' salaries/raises reminds one of the old bumper stickers that said, to paraphrase, *We heard there was a recession, but we decided not to participate*. Under Saunders, sources say that it seems USM administrators are becoming a special class of community citizens.
