Bonaparte Lands Job in Cali

LONG BEACH – Outgoing CoB-GC economist Yosef Bonaparte has landed a job in the Robert Day School of Economics and Finance at Claremont McKenna College in California. As long-time readers of USMNEWS.net are aware, Bonaparte was, according to former EFIB chairman George Carter, terminated unexpectedly by the Lance Nail administration (2008-present) of the CoB during the 2008-09 academic year. As a result of Nail's action, Bonaparte (pictured below) reportedly worked on a terminal contract during the 2009-10 academic year.



Bonaparte came to the CoB about two years ago from the University of Texas, as did former CoB ECOer Deniz Gevrek. During the 2009-10 academic year, the Martha Saunders administration (2007-present) of USM <u>eliminated</u> the CoB's economics programs and faculty, resulting in the forced retirement of five senior economists. The junior economists are scheduled to join the College of Arts & Letters on 1-July-2010. Gevrek was among that group before she departed for Texas A&M University at Corpus Christi in January-2010.
