Is a Racial Divide Forming on USM Campus?

HATTIESBURG – The Hattiesburg American's breaking news links reported on 14-Nov-2011 that several sorority students at USM were placed on sorority probation after a photo showing them dressed in blackface and costumes, reportedly in an effort to reflect the 1980s characters in the Huxtable family on the television sitcom The Cosby Show, became public. The costumes were worn as part of a 1980s-themed costume party that occurred off campus. A photo of the party-goers was submitted to *The Hattiesburg* American on 11-Nov-2011. Implicated in this latest on-campus race-based scandal are six current members of USM's chapter of Phi Mu (Φ M) sorority.

According to The Hattiesburg American, "The executive officers of Phi Mu and those members in the photo met on Sunday evening [13-Nov-2011] with a group of Southern Miss African-American student leaders." USM dean of students, Eddie Holloway, came out of the meeting with the view that the six ΦM members involved "... clear[ly]... had little cultural awareness or competency, and [they] did not understand the historical implication of costuming in blackface." The ΦM National Sorority also provided a response that denounced the action; this response was published by WLOX-TV News. Lastly, USM vice president for student affairs commented on the issue, stating that "... this photo was offensive, insensitive and regrettable, and is counter to the rich appreciation for diversity that marks our student body."
