Blame it on NiRiomand

More **AIB** Travel for the UH-V **Economist**-Dean

Former CoB associate dean (1998-2007) Farhang <u>Niroomand</u>, now the business dean at the University of Houston – Victoria, <u>continues to consume</u> travel budgets <u>to attend the annual meetings</u> of the Academy of International Business (AIB). As the voucher above (#100178) points out, Niroomand travelled to Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, on 23-June-2010 in order to "attend the Academy of International Business 2010 Annual Meeting being held at the Windsor Barra Hotel & Congressos . . ." The stated purpose (by Niroomand) of this particular trip was to "stay current in the area of International Business in order to keep the School of Business Administration current in the area of international business." After a week of *keeping the UH-V b-school current in IB*, Niroomand returned to the United States on 30-June-2010. How does attending the annual AIB meeting keep one "current" in the international business discipline? Better yet, how does one faculty's attendance at the annual AIB meeting keep an entire business college "current" in the international business discipline? Sources tell USMNEWS.net that these are very good questions, because none of Niroomand's explanations in the travel voucher above makes any sense.

Long-time readers of USMNEWS.net are aware that <u>Niroomand</u> is an **economist**, not an international business faculty. He began attending the annual AIB meetings when he was associate dean of USM's CoB. As the voucher above indicates, AIB meeting attendance is expensive. It is so expensive, in fact, that sources tell USMNEWS.net that none of the CoB's actual international business faculty was allowed funding to the AIB meetings because <u>Niroomand's</u> attendance was so costly for the CoB. If attending one of these meetings keeps one, and one's college, current in IB, wouldn't that really only apply to active researchers/teachers in the discipline, and not economist-administrators? Again, a good question, at least according to sources.

Lastly, the cost of Niroomand's junket to Rio came to at least \$3,000. How many individual faculty travel budgets in the b-school at UH-V were consumed by <u>Niroomand's</u> largesse in this case? If applied to USM's CoB, a few faculty might not be able to travel because <u>Niroomand</u> went to Rio. One would have to think that *even more* UH-V b-schoolers would be <u>inconvenienced</u> as a result of Niroomand's jaunt to Rio, given the different levels of the two institutions involved. Still, sources tell USMNEWS.net that before UH-V b-school faculty "Blame it on Rio," they should rejoice that <u>Niroomand's</u> visit to Brazil has kept them all "current" in international business.
