Bushardt Goes "A" ... Sort Of

Former CoB management professor Stephen Bushardt got off the journal publication schneid that he had been on since leaving USM's CoB over one year ago. Now with Spring Hill College in Mobile, AL, Bushardt recently published an article in the *Decision Sciences Journal of Innovative Education*.



Though CoBers and others may not view this journal as better than a C, if that, the CoB's 2007-08 Journal Ranking Committee (JRC), headed by then-*un*tenured assistant professor Sami Dakhlia, somehow managed to move this outlet into the A-journal column. That said, with Bushardt's departure for SHC, the CoB recently missed out on a top-level journal publication.

Former CoB marketing professor, Laurie Babin, departed the CoB after 2006-07 for the University of Louisiana – Monroe. Fisher Still Missed


