## Green Takes Carter's Overload Course and \$5,000

HATTIESBURG – In a follow-up to a prior reports here at USMNEWS.NET (see <u>Carter Ramps Up Clinical Teaching Gig</u> and <u>Was Carter's Clinical Teaching Program Nixed?</u>), reporters have learned (through SOAR) that associate professor of economics Trellis Green has taken on the overload section of ECO 201 that was put up "for sale" by EFIB Chair George Carter. Green will reportedly be paid \$5,000 to teach the section, which falls on MW at 3:30-4:45pm. With the addition of the 3-hour overload, Green's fall 2007 schedule is as follows:

With the \$5,000 overload payment, Green's 9-month income rises to \$83,583, at least for the 2007-08 academic year. This single payment, coming in Green's PERS window, increases his retirement base by at least \$1,250 per year, representing a nice boost in his defined benefits. This boost would have otherwise gone to Carter.

Long-time readers of USMNEWS.NET will recall that Green filed a lawsuit against Carter in 1994, claiming that Carter and others violated his rights in denying him (Green) a promotion to associate professor. In 1997, Carter settled his lawsuit with Green, and Green was awarded (1) promotion to associate, (2) a raise in salary, and (3) an undisclosed financial settlement.
