"Good Ol' Boy" to Chair 2 Departments and Occupy JGH Palace

HATTIESBURG – David Duhon, the management professor EFIB Chair George Carter refuses to believe should ever have been promoted to full, and who Carter refers to as one of the CoB's non-scholarly good ol' boys, was recently awarded something that Carter has yet to attain – chairmanship of **2 CoB departments**.
