A Look at CoB Google Scholar Cites by Top Source

Several reports here at USMNEWS.net have examined Google Scholar cites scores for CoB faculty. These have generally aggregated all of each faculty's GS cites and ranked the CoB's faculty from first to last on the basis of an aggregate score. Like previous reports, this report ranks CoB faculty, from first to last, based on GS cites. However, it does so using only GS cites counts from each faculty's top publication (i.e., each faculty's most heavily-cited paper). Table 1 below provides that ranking, along with the year and outlet contributing the cites for each CoB faculty.

Notes: The yellow highlighted entries represent the CoB's professorship holders. The blue frames depict the leaders in each of the CoB's academic disciplines -- i.e., accounting, business law, economics, fashion merchandising, finance, international business, management, management information systems, marketing, and tourism management. Finally, the gold frames surround some entries that are discussed in the text.

There are a number of interesting results in Table 1 above. First, the CoB's international business program appears to be in shambles. The leader of that program, John Lambert, sits in a 22-way tie for 46th in the CoB. Of course, Lambert has a total of 0 cites. Second, about one-third of the CoB's faculty roster has yet to produce any scholarly output that has picked up a Google Scholar cite. Third, new assistant professor of marketing, John Hansen, is poised to challenge some of the CoB's younger scholars. Despite not having been in academe very long, Hansen sits in 27th position, with 13 cites to his 2003 paper in Industrial Marketing Management. Hansen's success focuses attention on what sources report is John Clark's misguided research agenda. Clark, an *associate* professor of **finance**, is twelve spots ahead of Hansen, at 15th. But, it's the fact that Clark's top GS cites getter (with 23) is a paper in the Journal of Advertising Research that warrants attention. Amazingly, new economics hire, Yosef Bonaparte, who has yet to officially join the CoB, has 4 GS cites to an unpublished paper (that is available on the Internet). With that, Bonaparte is 38th in the CoB, and only seven spots behind associate professor of economics, Sami Dakhlia, who has been around academia for about a decade. Finally, this report would be remiss if it failed to highlight Mary Anderson's 46th ranking. This is significant because some believe that Anderson will

be the next *Morgan Distinguished Professor of Accounting*. That might not be so bad, however, as Roderick Posey, the current holder of that professorship, sits right there with Anderson in the 22-way tie for 46th, and he claims to have published more than 100 articles on accounting topics.

During the production of the report entitled "Second Best," another error and one omission regarding this report was discovered. The error concerned MIS' Donna Davis, while Mark Klinedinst of ECO was omitted from the original report altogether. These have been fixed in Table 1 above. Also, any errors in the text above resulting from these issues have been addressed as well.

A recent audit of the results in this report by USMNEWS.net reporters uncovered four incorrect entries. These pertained to John Clark (FIN), Akbar Marvasti (ECO), Farooq Malik (FIN) and Elizabeth LaFleur (MKT). Table 1 has been corrected, and the changes are noted in orange font. A few portions of the text above were also affected by these corrections to Table 1. As a result, the text was altered a bit, also in orange font.

Prior reports on Google Scholar cites have cautioned readers as to the difficulty in dealing with the GS engine. Our reporters make every effort to keep these reports as accurate as possible. Auditing them is part of that process.
