research trail. Now the head of Louisiana Tech's marketing department, Babin recently had a paper accepted by the B-level *Journal of Retailing and Consumer Services*.





When Haggard left the CoB after one year (2006-07) she had yet to publish an academic journal article. That is no longer true, given her recent publication in the *International Journal of Organization Theory & Behavior*.



While at USM Haggard was never particularly well-treated by members of the CoB's management unit. Sources told USMNEWS.net at the time that the MGT faculty felt that Haggard had been foisted upon them with the hiring by FIN of Haggard's husband Stephen. However, editorials and other reports here at USMNEWS.net were stating at that time that Dana Haggard was much better (in terms of potential) than most, if not all, of the candidates that the CoB's long-time MGT faculty were making efforts to hire during the 2003-07 Harold Doty administration of the CoB.

Meanwhile, another former CoB assistant professor of MGT, Brian Gregory, is now doing well at Northern Arizona University. Gregory (shown below) departed the CoB at about the same time as Haggard, after staying at USM on a brief time longer than her.
