## "Significant Contributor" to CoB Lauded

In Jim Coll's <u>29-October-08 presser</u> entitled "Southern Miss Alumni Association to Induct Seven Into Hall of Fame" USM officials announced that Bruce Rossmeyer, "a significant contributor to the College of Business," will be inducted into the USM Alumni Hall of Fame on 31-October-08 during a ceremony at Southern Oaks House and Gardens in Hattiesburg. Rossmeyer is one of seven inductees who will join the Hall of Fame, bringing the Hall's total membership to 221.

## The 2008 inductees are:

- Tena Clark, Class of 1976. A resident of Valencia, Calif., Clark is Grammy-nominated songwriter and the founder of DMI, a premier music branding agency.
- Reggie Collier, Class of 2004. The legendary Golden Eagle quarterback and Hattiesburg resident serves as the coordinator of athletic development and community relations for the Eagle Club.
- Ken McCarty, Classes of 1956 and 1958. An educator who has taught more than 16,000 University of Southern Mississippi students, McCarty is professor emeritus of history at Southern Miss and a Hattiesburg resident.
- W.A. Payne, Class of 1972. A successful businessman, the Hattiesburg resident is chairman of the Camelia Group, which offers health care and hospice services to residents of Mississippi, Louisiana and Florida.
- May Lewis Poetter, Class of 1962. The Savannah, Ga., resident is a founder of the Savannah College of Art and Design, the largest higher education institution of art and design in the world.
- Bruce Rossmeyer. A resident of Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., Rossmeyer operates the world's largest Harley-Davidson

• Charles Thomas, Class of 1955. The Hattiesburg resident is one of the biggest supporters of the arts at Southern Miss.

As the insert above shows, the biggest thing that separates Rossmeyer, the Harley Davidson magnate, from the other six inductees into USM's **Alumni** Hall of Fame, is the fact that Rossmeyer is <u>not</u> a USM alumnus. Whether or not this fact separates Rossmeyer from the other 214 current members of the Hall is not known.

Sources tell USMNEWS.net that Rossmeyer might be best known for his speech at a CoB donors' dinner just a few years ago wherein Rossmeyer was allowed to take the rostrum despite exhibiting the effects of inebriation.
