USMPRIDE's New "Your Value-to-Niroomand's Value" Calculator

CoB faculty often wonder just how Dean Harold Doty and his administrative team view the value of their service to the College and to the University. To assist CoB faculty in quantifying their value to the CoB, USMPRIDE has developed the *new* "Your Value-to-Niroomand's Value" Calculator. This device uses your 2006 merit raise – which represents the most recent opportunity that CoB administration has had to assess the value of everyone's contributions – and CoB Associate Dean Farhang Niroomand's 2006 merit raise (as inputs). Because Niroomand's \$9,282 merit raise for 2006 was the CoB's largest, it seemed like a natural baseline for assessing all other non-administrative track faculty values (to the CoB). Thus, the *new* calculator computes your individual 2006 merit raise as a percentage of Niroomand's 2006 merit raise. The results are presented alphabetically in Table 1 below:

Notes: Color-coded grading system, based on the standard grading scale, is used in the table above, as in: A, B, C, D, and F.

As the data in Table 1 above indicate, the vast majority of CoB faculty failed to reach the 60%-mark in terms of individual value-to-Niroomand's value (i.e., individual 2006 merit raises as a percent of Niroomand's 2006 merit raise). Thus, USMPRIDE is forced to give the vast majority of CoB faculty a failing grade (for value). John Clark, associate professor of finance, and Jon Carr, associate professor of management, earned strong Bs in terms of their values to the CoB. Other CoB faculty with passing grades (Ds) are Stan Clark (professor of accounting), Charles Sawyer (professor of economics), and Kenneth Zantow (assistant professor of management). Thus, only five CoB faculty received passing grades; the remaining 47 CoB faculty all *failed*.

Some of the individual grades are interesting. For example, finance professor Tom Lindley, whose career has mirrored that of Ray Canterbery's (the former Scholar-in-Residence) according to a recent USMPRIDE report, scores only a 38.3 on this scale. That is, Niroomand's left arm, shoulder, pectoral, and abdomen are valued by the CoB about as much as Tom Lindley. Chang-Tseh Hsieh, the CoB's McCarty Distinguished Professor of MIS, is valued by the CoB about as much as Niroomand's lower and upper torso.

Nearer to the low end, visiting assistant professor of economics Weihua Shi holds about as much value to the CoB as Niroomand's left foot and lower left leg. Teaching mogul Amy Sevier, instructor of management, represents little more value to the CoB than Shi. In fact, the teaching firm of Fennell, Loyd and Sevier, when combined, account for only Niroomand's mid-to-upper torso and below, or a little more than 80% of Niroomand's value to the CoB.
