## Hudson Out as UHV President; Has Niroomand Lost His Protector?

Former USM provost Tim Hudson resigned his position as president of the University of Houston at Victoria just before the beginning of the current academic year (2010-11) in order to become Special Assistant to the Chancellor (of the UH System) for International Programs and Initiatives. In a UHV presser (linked above), UHS Chancellor Renu Khator praised Hudson's prior work as UHV president, commending him for assisting UHV in becoming a "destination" university with 4,000 students. The move does, however, look to sources to be a demotion, which is a view shared by at least one poster ("USMtriedandtrue") to the USM Forum Message Board, who describes Hudson, pictured below, as having been "run out of Victoria" and now looking to become president of Western Illinois University. A visit to the WIU website confirmed that Hudson's interview visit is scheduled for 1-December-2010. A 12-August-2010 article by Jeannie Kever for The Houston Chronicle, which indicates that Hudson's salary will remain at \$270,000, seems to back up the idea that Khator no longer wanted Hudson to continue in his role as UHV president. When asked by Kever if the position change was a reflection on Hudson's tenure as president, Khator stated that "[h]is contract was up anyway . . . [h]e and I had long conversations about the best way to go." Hudson's first act as SACIPI was to take a vacation, reminding USMNEWS.net sources of the 2007 CoB "retirements" of Harold Doty and Farhang Niroomand.

Long time readers of USMNEWS.net will recall that Niroomand, the CoB's associate dean from 1998-2007, was <a href="https://linear.com/hiroomand">hirod</a> by Hudson in 2008 as <a href="https://linear.com/hiroomand">UHV's</a> business school dean. However, with Hudson's resignation, Niroomand, pictured above, may have lost his "protector," possibly putting him in jeopardy should he engage in <a href="https://shenanigans.like.those">shenanigans.like.those</a> he reportedly engaged in while at USM. (The fact that contacts from the UHV business school informed USMNEWS.net that the hiring of Niroomand was done in the proverbial dark of night suggests that little has changed about Niroomand's professional life.) Sources tell USMNEWS.net that if Hudson's attempt to become WIU's next president is successful, Niroomand's <a href="https://dream.job.may.migrate">dream.job.may.migrate</a> northward, from Victoria, Texas, to Macomb, Illinois. Sources add that, at that point, Niroomand may be ready to become a provost, or some other executive in the WIU central administration.
