Since I know you are interested in business issues and the cost of education, I am sending you a link to a very interesting article -- particularly if you are a parent or a student. <u>Why 2016 Will</u> <u>Be a Big Year For Student Loans</u>. According to the article, the class of 2015 will have an average student loan debt of more than \$35,000.

As you reported yesterday, tuition at a bottom tier university like Southern Miss will soon exceed \$7,000 per year. That's just tuition.
