I recently read the Breaking News story "Strain of AACSB Accreditation Woes Showing," and I must say that if Alvin Williams is starting to admit problems, the accreditation situation must be dire.

As noted on the pages of USMNEWS.NET, the modus operandi for the CoB's long time team players is to deny, deny, deny the truth and/or to keep repeating the same lie until folks believe the lie is true. If that's true, the CoB's AQ problems have gotten worse, and there'll be no way to fix that problem before the coming 6th Year Review visit in February 2008.

It will be interesting to watch just how Alvin Williams and his team of loyalists stretch, spin, slant, and spread the "truth" about the CoB's accreditation problems. They're in a bad place right now, and there's no easy way out of it. I hope USMNEWS.NET keeps the CoB administrators' feet to the fire.
