Now, about 25 days into the Alvin Williams regime in the CoB, we learn just what Williams' plan for "getting civility back into Joe Greene Hall" was all about. It's too bad the plan was such an utter failure, and that May 4, 2007, was about as sorry a day as the CoB has The one seen in quite some time. bright spot was management professor Sharon Topping, who comes away from the whole sad episode that was the CoB's Spring Faculty meeting of 2007 looking more Deanly than Williams on his best day so far. In fact, Topping's speech to the CoB should be framed and hung on the walls of Joe Greene Hall in place of former Dean Doty's missions and visions.

Let's apply some "rubrics" to the meeting and see how the CoB came out. 2=the number of USM Police Officers that were called in to adjourn the meeting. That's 2 more than I expected would be there.
