ECO Credits, ECO Debits A LOOK AT THE FALL 2009 SCH DEBATE IN ECONOMICS

USMNEWS.net readers are familiar with the recent debate that developed between CoB dean Lance Nail and CoB associate professor of economics Sami Dakhlia over how many student credit hours (SCH) are taught by CoB economists. This report provides SCH data that were obtained from the USM Registrar (24-Aug-09) so that USMNEWS.net readers can better evaluate the relative merits of that debate.

As Table 1 makes clear, economics professors William Gunther and Akbar Marvasti are of little value to the CoB. They produce a combined SCH total of only 399, yet they earn a combined \$265,000 per year (approx.) in salary and benefits. Each has been involved in a number of scandals over the years as well, some of which are described in the USMNEWS.net Archives. Professor Mark Klinedinst, who has been leading ECO's charge against the USM administration over the proposal to eliminate the economics major, is in a similar position as Marvasti, with only 267 SCH. Klinedinst takes home about \$110,000 per year in salary and benefits, and he has not published an article in an indexed economics journal since 1998!
