According to a <u>24-Aug-09 report</u> filed by *The Hattiesburg American*, only 9 USM students showed up at the Aubrey K. Lucas Administration Building on 24-Aug-09 in order to protest the USM administration's recent decision to eliminate the CoB's economics programs and terminate its 9 tenured/tenure-track faculty. That number represents even less than the dismal number of CoB students who are now majoring in economics.

According to THA, the protesters held up signs that said "Support Economics," and, at one point, they walked through the AKLA building. According to sources, such a low turnout had to be a blow to the economists, who made an oral appeal to the USM administration on 24-Aug-09 to rescind the cuts, which former EFIB chairman George Carter says are the result of subterfuge on the part of USM administrators.
