Like it or not, it's certainly not the same thing as the four month vacation that Harold Doty and Farhang Niroomand got when they turned in their surprise "resignations" (as dean and associate dean, respectively) back in April-07. At least Davis will be burning time earned for service, not for dereliction of duty, for which many believe Doty and Niroomand were essentially rewarded.

There has been some talk about Trellis Green (ECO) getting a behind-the-scenes "phased retirement" deal that will keep him around a bit longer. If accurate, that could put Green in the position of possibly securing support to keep his job permanently, now that Sami Dakhlia is following Deniz Gevrek out of Hattiesburg. The possibilities here will likely hinge on Mark Klinedinst's (ECO) efforts to keep his own job after 2009-10. It will be interesting to see if either one turns out to be the sort of "sacred cow" that Klinedinst has been speaking out against around campus.

Speaking of budget cuts, some are chattering about upcoming cuts in CoB advising (room 110). People are also talking about two secretaries being let go. Word is also going around about Chang-Tseh Hsieh hinting that a departure may be in the near future for him. Such a move might actually release some pressure in information systems. Kuo Lane Chen could follow Hsieh out, making some room to possibly keep Dale Lunsford. Lunsford must be giddy about this chatter.
