The table above presents 2007 Google Scholar citations data for the CoB's 10 economists. At the top of the list is Franklin Mixon, who has 308 citations, accounting for 59.2 percent of the unit's total count (of 520). Edward Nissan, who constitutes 10 percent of the unit, has produced 11.5 percent of the unit's Google Scholar citations. Mark Klinedinst, another full, is also just covering his own 10 percent portion of the unit. The remaining fulls, former CBA Dean William Gunther and EFIB Chair George Carter, have produced only 6 and 4.6 percent, respectively, of the unit's total Google Scholar citations count.

Unlike the other units, everyone in ECO has produced at least one Google Scholar cite. In fact, the lowest number in ECO is five. Also unlike other units, ECO's ranking conforms to what one would expect of units if ranked by academic rank (i.e., full then assoc then assist). There is a small blip in this expectation with Trellis Green and Sami Dakhlia, and a more substantial blip involving Akbar Marvasti, an associate who sits at the bottom. According to sources, Marvasti will soon be a full, further distorting the ECO list above. Sources tell USMNEWS.NET that Marvasti has been Google Scholar cited less than one time for every five years he has contributed to the profession.
