The five names listed in red *have even completed the PhD-level coursework in economics*, making them more than excellent candidates for the task at hand. The contents of Table 1 support the contention in <u>Saved by Departures</u>, which is that von Herrmann appears to be working hard to secure a spot in the CoAL for CoAL faculty favorite Mark Klinedinst. In doing so, she may be aligning herself with USM president Martha Saunders in a standoff of sorts against USM provost Robert Lyman.
