Add Deniz Gevrek to the Mix of Long Distance CoBers

The [recent run](#) of USMNEWS.net reports [showing](#) how more and more CoB faculty are choosing to maintain residences outside of Mississippi is not showing any signs of slowing at present. That run continues this week with the revelation that newly-hired *untenured* assistant professor of economics Deniz Gevrek has joined the mix, as indicated by the top portion of Gevrek's curriculum vitae (inserted below). According to Gevrek's own vitae, she maintains a residence in Austin, TX, which is **597 miles** from the USM campus in Hattiesburg.

This latest discovery comes on the heels of one indicating that another *untenured* assistant professor of economics, Daniel Monchuk, maintains a residence in Washington, D.C., *almost 1,000 miles* from USM's CoB. This recent find also increases the number of unique states (counting the District of Columbia) that CoBers are calling home to **7**, including Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas. A more detailed accounting of this phenomenon is provided in Table 1 below.
