Lyman Gives Up the Goods

USM provost Robert Lyman was once again interviewed by *The Hattiesburg American*'s higher education reporter Ed Kemp about the \$8 million Aug-o9 budget cut at the institution. Lyman told Kemp – for Kemp's <u>27-Aug-o9 story</u> entitled "Concern raised over cuts at USM" – that Southern Miss is putting tenured/tenure-track faculty in economics *and* technical and occupational education on the chopping block as a result of program elimination. And although Kemp reports that those faculty who will be terminated had a chance to appeal that decision on 24-Aug-o9 and now await the 1-Sept-o9 deadline for faculty terminations to judge the success of their appeals, Lyman told Kemp that the program terminations that will result in the firing of the economics/education faculty will be put before the IHL Board at either its September-o9 or October-o9 meetings. Thus, Lyman inadvertently gave Kemp the results of the 24-Aug-o9 appeals during the interview for Kemp's 27-Aug-o9 story linked above. This likely comes as a shocker to those faculty in economics/education.

Speaking of Lyman, sources say that the photo of Lyman included in Ed Kemp's latest *THA* article, which is inserted below, shows a much more serious provost. Hauer They Doing Over in ECO?

As reported in Ed Kemp's 27-Aug-09 *THA* article linked above, English professor Stanley Hauer, a 32-year veteran of USM, said he supports the Saunders administration's decision to cut the CoB's economics programs and terminate its 9 tenured/tenure-track faculty. According to Hauer, the cuts are "necessary" in the current economic climate. Hauer is the first USM faculty member, outside of administration, to speak openly to the media in support of the administration's decision to eliminate the programs and faculty. That he comes from liberal arts is also interesting. Sources say that cracks in the support for ECO have been developing in recent days, and Hauer may simply be the first evidence of them to reach the general public.
