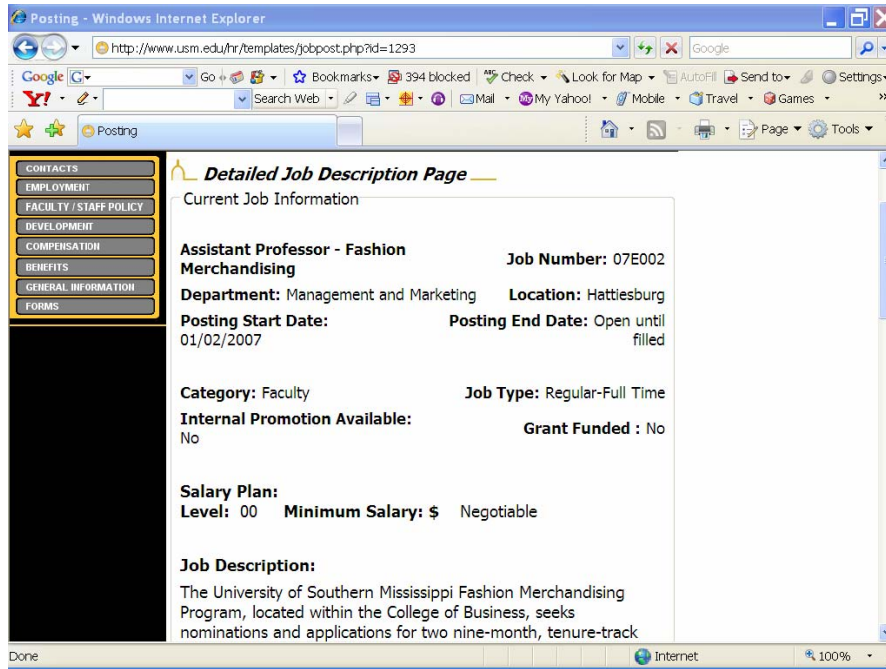
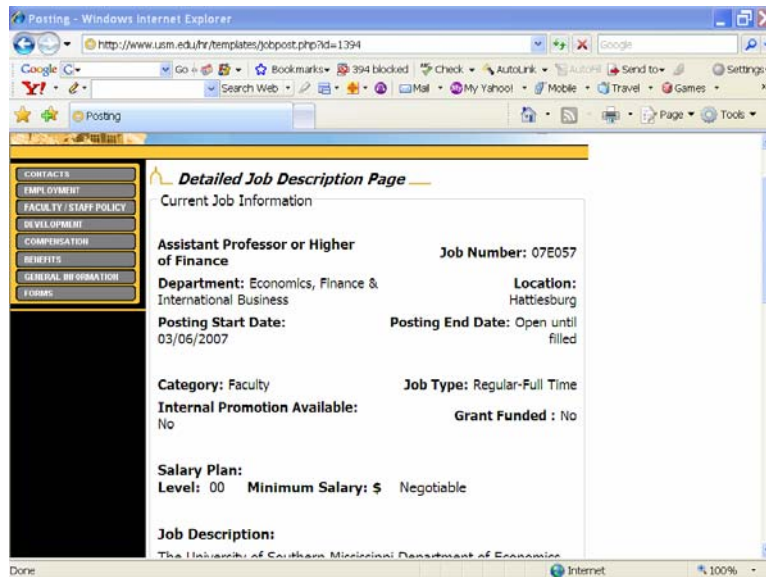


Need a Job? Check out the CoB

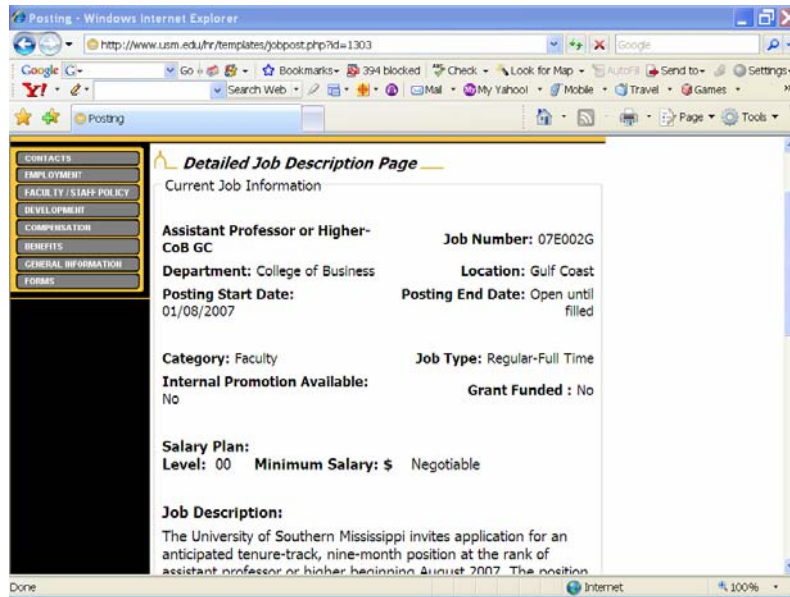
The following CoB-related employment possibilities were found on the USM website during June of 2007. Some are quite interesting.



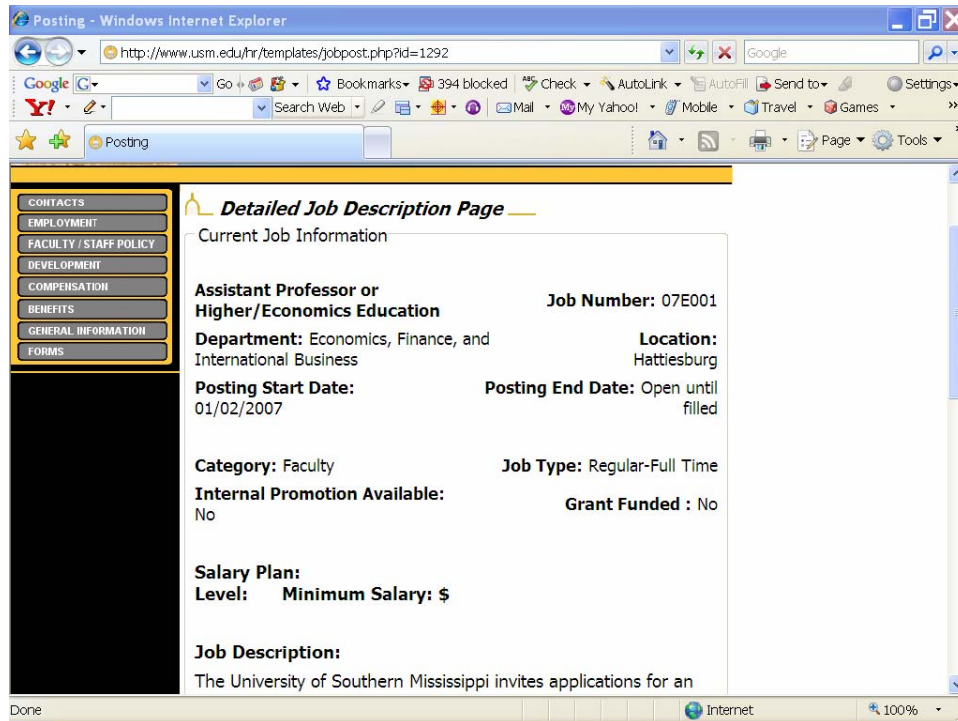

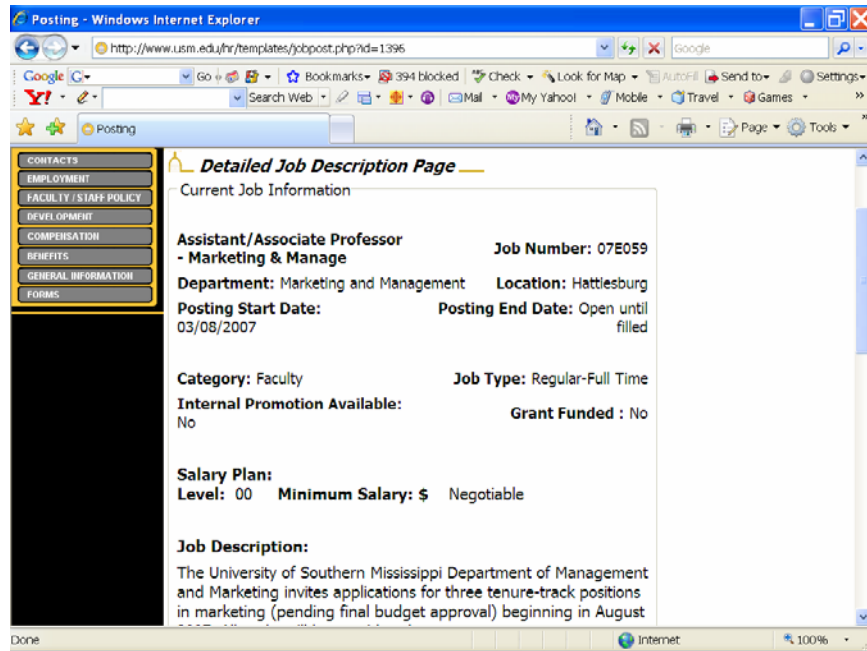
Sources tell USMNEWS.NET that the finance faculty do not even know this search (see ad above) is underway. This should make for some interesting conversations in the near future.



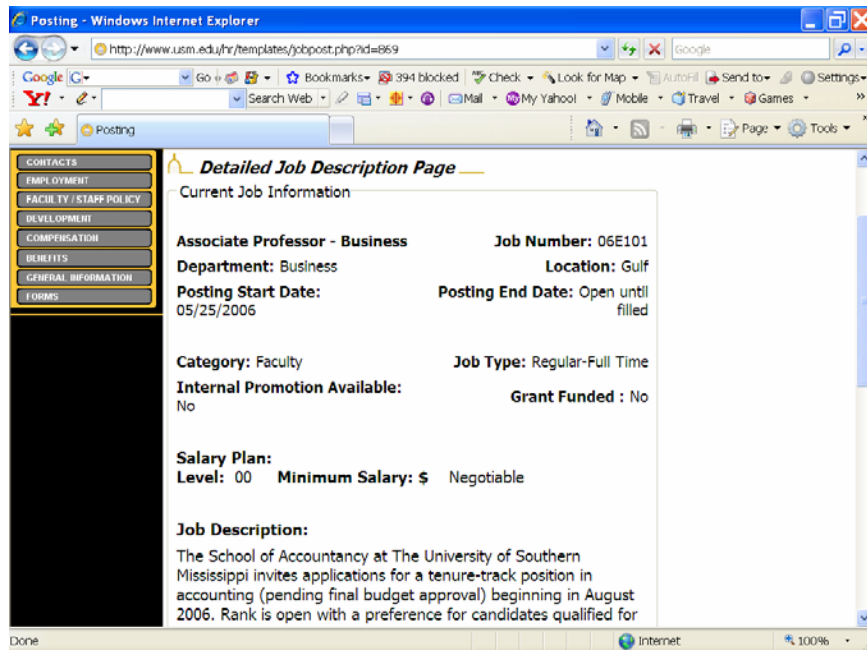
The ad above is for a new Director of the CoB's Bureau of Business and Economics Research. Assistant Professor? Gulf Coast? What happened to JGH 313?



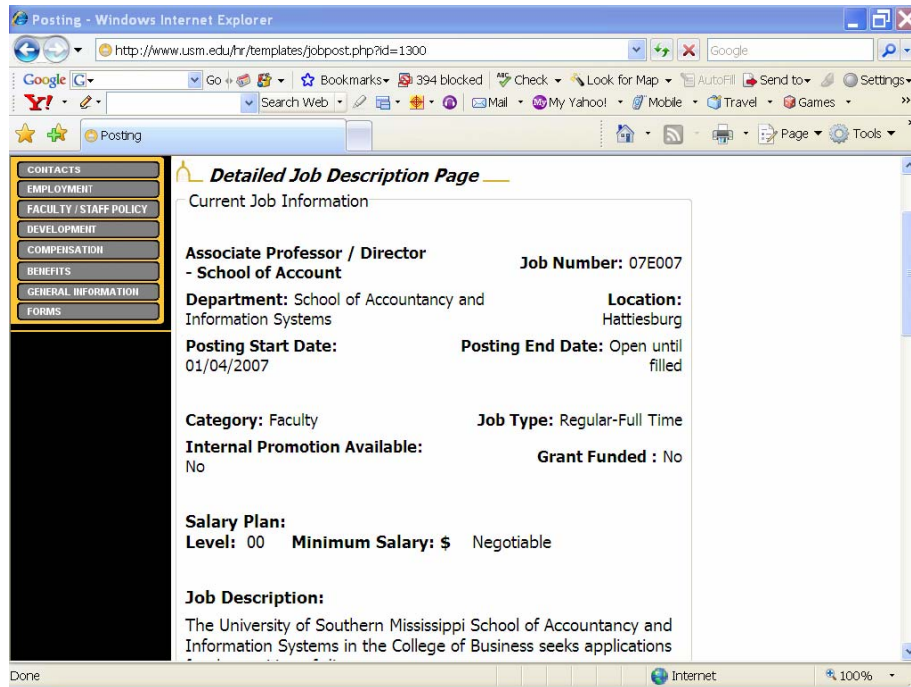

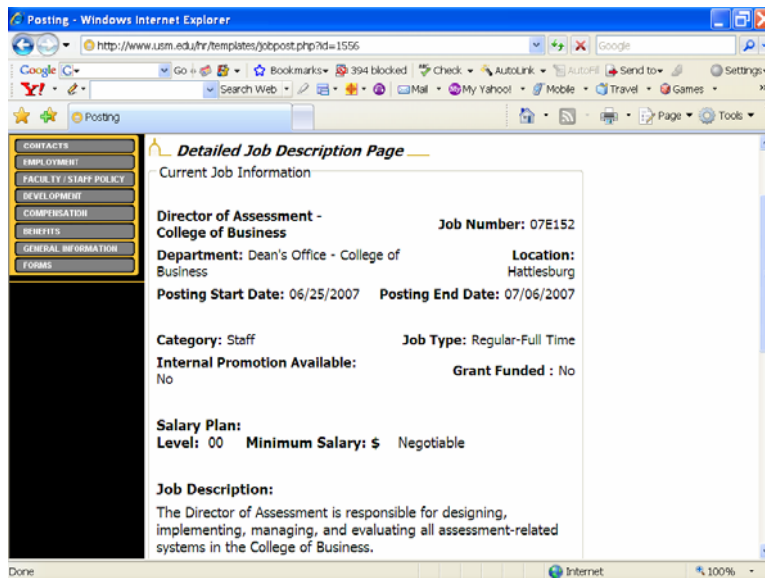
Notice that the ad above is for three tenure-track positions in marketing. That covers the Babins (Barry and Laurie) and Tara Lopez.



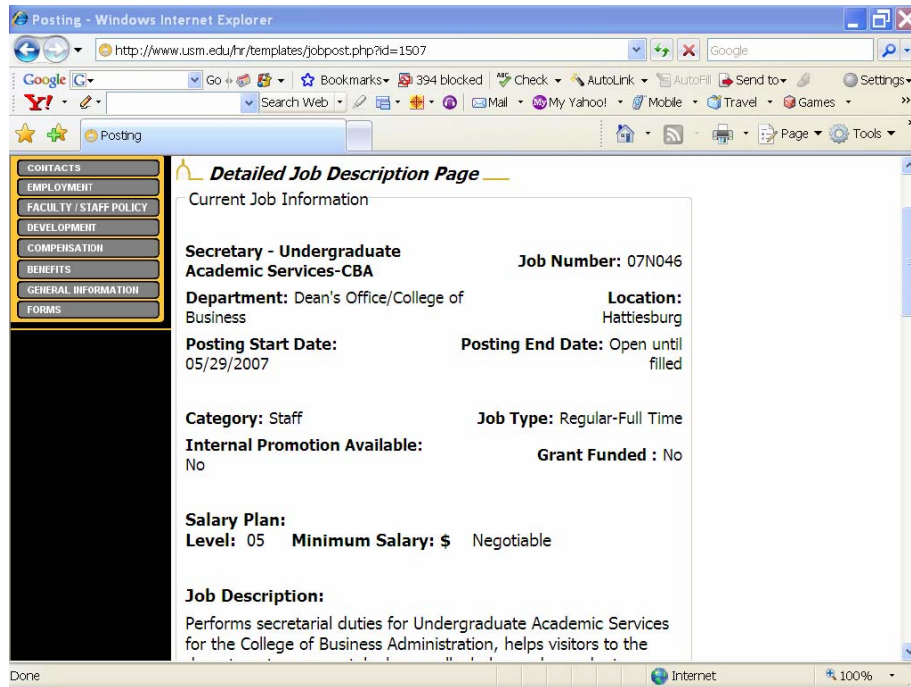
Why is the ad above still around? Isn't this Steven Jackson's position? Or, is the Coast in perpetual hiring mode?



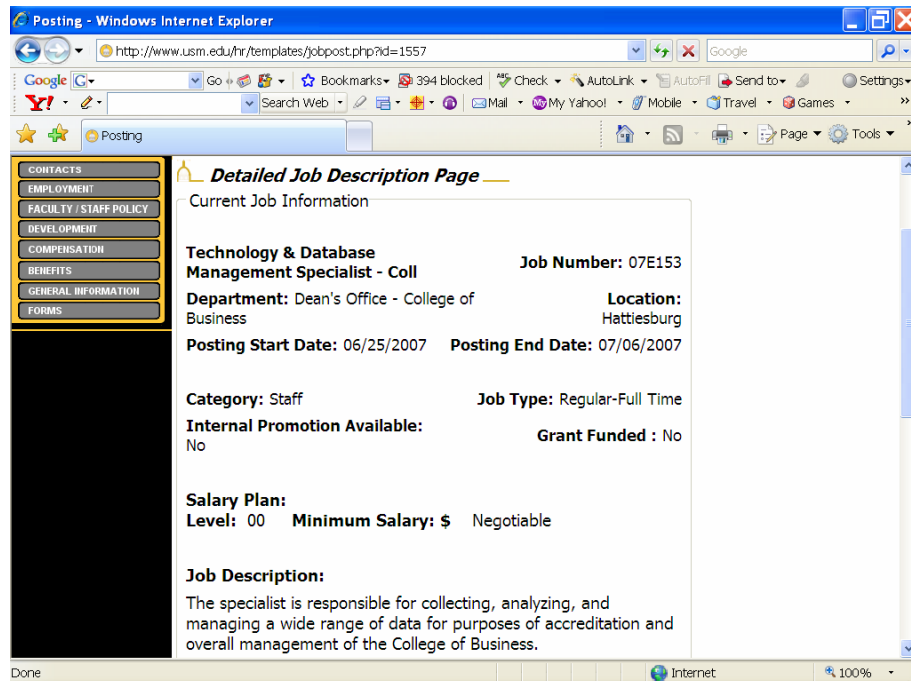

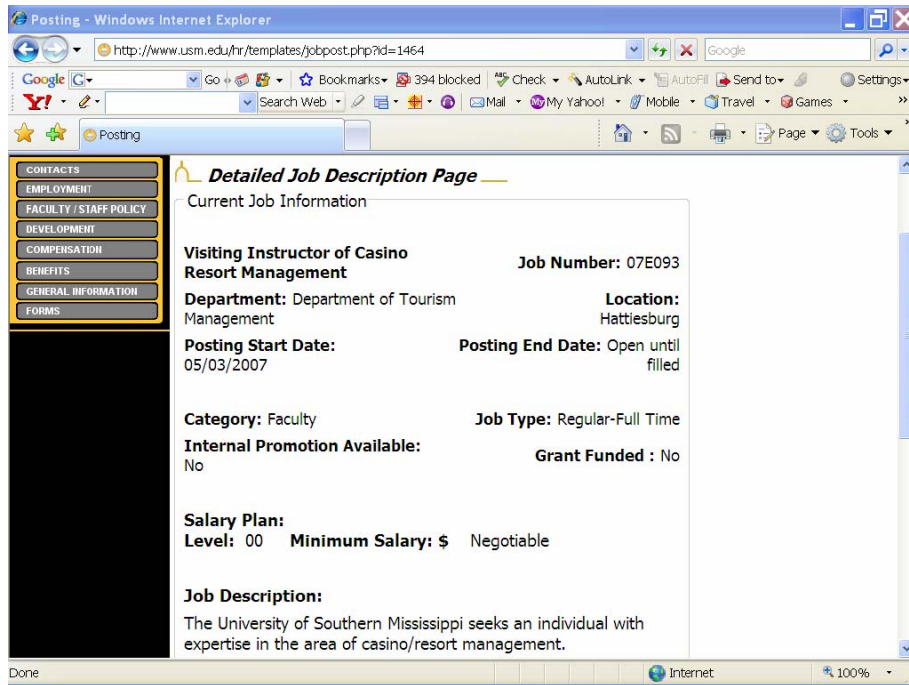
