## One CoB, Two Deans

Within days of them taking the reins at their new b-school dean posts, former CoB administrators Harold Doty (University of Texas – Tyler) and Farhang Niroomand (University of Houston – Victoria) had worked and re-worked their "Dean's Message" statements on their respective college/school websites. Each had also experimented with multiple accompanying photographs before settling in on a preferred one. CoB dean Lance Nail, however, has yet to even draft a single "Dean's Message" for the USM website, even though he's been on board as CoB dean since 1-July-08 (12 months ago). While most CoBers would never now choose to have either Doty or Niroomand hanging around as CoB dean on a day-to-day basis, they would prefer an inside dean, and not a "ghost dean" as Nail has become. Though Nail probably will not be around the CoB when AACSB rolls back to town in 2012 – some say he's now after the same position at Salisbury University – if he is still around then CoB faculty are sure to whisper to Peer Review Team members that the "ghost dean" thing isn't working so much for them, or the CoB.
