Corrected 6-Aug-09, Details Below Painting by Numbers Yet Again

A Look at Google Scholar Cites, Aug-09

With talk of \$2 million budget cuts and losses of academic programs in USM's CoB, it seemed like the proper time to bring back USMNEWS.net's series on Google Scholar cites to CoB faculty. Table 1 below reports the most recent (Aug-09) data, which will be the focus of a number of reports here at USMNEWS.net over the next few days. The faculty names are color-coded by unit: ACC, DS, ECO, FIN, FM, MGT, MKT, and TM.

As the data above indicate, **FIN** absolutely dominates the top 5 of the CoB. With **James Lindley**, **Lance Nail** and **Ernest King**, the **FIN** is not in jeopardy of being relegated below the top of the CoB at any point in the near term. Another thing of note above is that, with *five* separate faculty, **MGT** dominates the 11 through 16 spots in the CoB's top 60. Though not the CoB's star unit by any stretch, **MGT** is no longer the CoB's whipping boy in terms of research profile.

Based on Table 1, **FM** could be in some trouble if recent speculation about it being on the chopping block are true. Two of its three faculty are tied for last (46th), while its best faculty is ranked 30th, or just inside the top half of all CoB faculty. Despite the loss of **Cherylynn Becker**'s 71 GS cites to **MGT**, **TM** is still doing adequately in the rankings. **TM** chair **Catherine Price** is in the CoB's top 25, while **Babu**

George is in its top 30. So as far as program cutting is concerned, TM may be on more solid footing than FM, at least as far as the faculty component is concerned.

As for the third program rumored to be in jeopardy, **ECO** is slipping, and fast. No longer are there any **ECO** faculty in the top 5. And, sources indicate that two of the three who remain in the top 10 will not likely do so in a few weeks.

The number of ACC faculty who occupy the final position has to be troubling to both Lance Nail and Skip Hughes, the new SoA director. Among this group are Roderick Posey, the *Morgan Distinguished Professor of Accounting*, former director Steven Jackson and Mary Anderson. Sources have stated that this must be embarrassing for Nail, and possibly (now) Hughes. Interestingly, Gwen Pate has made a nice climb from the bottom of late, with 4 GS cites to her credit now.

Finally, it is difficult to imagine a b-school without MKT. That difficulty aside, one might think MKT would be in jeopardy, given its dismal record in Table 1 above. Michael Wittmann is its only top 20 member, while Wittmann and Elizabeth LaFleur are the only MKT reps in the top 25. This unit has fallen off the proverbial map since the arrival of former CoB dean Harold Doty in 2003.

An audit of this report turned up an error in recording James Lindley's GS cites count. Lindley's count should have been entered as 656, and not 754 as it was originally. However, he still holds a commanding lead even after the correction.
