After his <u>retirement in 2015</u>, the IHL has summoned Joe Paul to serve as Southern Miss' eleventh president. A <u>Southern Miss alumnus</u>, Dr. Paul has served various administrative functions for more than 40 years. He replaces Dr. Rodney Bennett who was touted as "… the first African-American president of a historically and predominantly white higher education institution in Mississippi."

A few questions seem obvious.

Why did the IHL appoint someone who, based on age, is a caretaker president? In fact, Dr. Paul appears to be a clear break from the previous two progressive hires of Dr. Rodney Bennett and Dr. Martha Saunders.

We know what happened to Dr. Saunders. If he has been employed, aren't he and USM proud to announce it?
