Renu's Renegades A GUEST EDITORIAL

The recent USMNEWS.net editorial (<u>18-Oct-2011</u>) on University of Houston-Victoria business dean <u>Farhang Niroomand</u> is right on the mark. While he was associate dean of the CoB at USM under Harold Doty (2003-07), now the wayward business dean at the University of Texas-Tyler, Niroomand had to be "pulled away" from various CoB faculty on multiple occasions.
