

SEDONA Files

In an effort to shed more light on the annual evaluation process in the CoB, this is Part I in a series of examinations of CoB faculty SEDONA materials, as they appeared on 2 May 2006, or just after the time of the CoB's annual evaluation. Previous exhibits have pointed out that CoB faculty are responsible for maintaining their CV items on SEDONA, an electronic database. As stated in an e-mail by Dean Doty, SEDONA materials **only** are to be evaluated by CoB administrators at the annual review hearing.

This installment examines "refereed articles" and other research related documentation. We first turn to Stephen Bushardt's SEDONA listing of refereed articles, which includes two separate entries:
