It really goes without saying that USMNEWS.net's *The Toadies* has been a welcomed addition to the reading menus of many people. The particular strip above addresses the <u>latest USM tragedy</u> – the targeting by USM administrators of various faculty who

are now, via downward mobbing, having their lives and careers destroyed. For those who are wondering about the one thing that could drop USM from the ranks of mainstream institutions for good, this new program of identifying "dangerous" faculty could easily be it.



With USM facing a \$10 million budget cut for 2010-11, and another \$7 million or so in cuts for 2011-12, editorial cartoons like that above from *The Student Printz* quickly became fan favorites. These budget cuts were met by the Saunders administration with plans to eliminate economics, Greek, Latin, philosophy, information systems, and other programs in education and elsewhere. Some of these cuts were recently reversed via <u>appeals</u>. Still, other cuts held, so that now USM no longer has an economics faculty on staff, and other programs are currently being ushered out.



With the satire above, usmlite.com made a statement about Saunders' recent decision to elevate Gordon Cannon to vice president of research at USM. Professor Cannon served the administration as ombudsman during the first known mobbing case, which involved the USMNEWS.net editor. Many see this new appointment for Cannon <u>as payment</u> for that infamous service.
