## QUESION: WHATSHOUD A TRIP TO KUBS COST?

## WHERE?

## KUBS, OF COURSE!

If you are a new reader of this series, catch up by reviewing A Brief History of Saunders' "Lea se" of a impla ne N777AQ During a Recession, Part 1. That report provides background information conceming the actual costs for the first 17 months of an aiplane N777AQ leased by President Sa unders for a 60-month period. For example, USM documents report total a ctual cost of $\$ 591,231.71$ during the first 17 months of a irpla ne N777AQ operations.

Interdepartmental Invoices for 30 flights were provided in an initial response from USM to a Mississippi Open RecordsAct (MORA) request conceming the a irpla ne President Saunders lea ses and pays for with Mississippi taxpayer and student dollars. Although the MORA request was for all records related to the plane, USM's response was incomplete. When legal counsel followed up conceming the inadequate response, the University produced more documents. usmnews.net reporters are c urrently reviewing the additional documents and there a re reasons to believe the response was again incomplete. The following is one example.

## To KUBS for reasons unknown

We now have the pilot's log, which USM legal counsel provided after we noted the original request was incomplete. On February 11, 2009, a USM Pilot Tip Log represents that airplane N777AQ flew to KUBS. The pilot's log for the flight to KUBS is inc omplete in several important aspects. There is no Interdepartmental Invoice a nd no purpose was given for the trip. Since no Interdepartmental Invoice was provided, no information was given with regard to the office ordepartment "charged" for the flight.

AirNa v.com reports KUBS as C olumbus-Lowndes C ounty Aiport, Columbus, MS. (www.aimav.com/aiport/KUBS) The passengers were Martha Saunders, D. Davies, a nd J oe Paul. The number of flight hours reported were1.6.

We do know that the flight was paid for by taxpayers a nd students in the a mount of \$9,900.27 (1.6 flight hours $\times \$ 6,187.67$ per flight hour).
(Remember, usmnews.net's computation of cost does not inc lude or amortize the $\$ 907,053.85$ balloon payment due on the 60 th month. If that

## amount is included, the cost per flight hour is substantially higher than $\$ 6,187.67$.)

## WHO'S MONITORING THESE "PUBLC SERVANIS"?

The disorganized response to our MOR request and the incomplete information signal iresponsible accountability and questionable use of taxpayer and student a ssets.

We all know that costs of higher education are skyrocketing. Is a nyone in authority holding USM and IHL administrators accountable? IHL members blessed the lease/purchase of the plane. IHL members are enjoying the use of the plane (see the list of passengers in past and future reports in this series.) So, do not expect the IHL to do its oversight responsibility and hold President Sa unders a c countable for this extravagant expenditure of taxpayer and student money. A corollary is to expect costs of higher education to continue to unnecessarily increase.
