

## Hands in the CoB

With the April 2007 publication of his latest book, *Hands in the Till: Embezzlement of Public Monies in Mississippi*, accounting professor James R. Crockett is once again in the spotlight. The book (see cover below) marks the second from Crockett in the past few years, both dealing with public sector corruption in Mississippi.



As the header on the book cover states, Crockett's book reports on "Shocking Cases in Which Stewardship Became Malfeasance." There have been a number of reports made available by usmnews.net that question Crockett's stewardship, in his former role as SAIS Director (and beyond), of MS taxpayer-provided funds.
