## **Hovering Lieutenants**

## A Look at Thames Era Leaders who Remain Near the Top of USM

The ongoing USM Research Foundation (Pinion Properties) scandal involving Jay Grimes and Richard Hadden, two highly-placed officials from the Shelby Thames administration (2002-07), coupled with the mystery surrounding the recent "resignation" announcement from USM chief financial officer Joe Morgan, another former Thames administration executive, highlights the perils facing current USM president Martha Saunders from retaining/relying on the former president's lieutenants. Listed below are a number of other servants of the Thames administration who continue to hold important positions in the Saunders administration (note: Morgan's actual departure is still weeks away).

Whether or not these officials cause Saunders additional problems remains to be seen. However, reports here at USMNEWS.net have <u>shown</u> that members of the USM and Hattiesburg communities have serious reservations about Joe Morgan and Russ Willis.<sup>1</sup> Willis, currently the Director of Human Resources, will assume the CFO duties in August-2010 (when Morgan steps down). Finally, there is also a thread on the *USM Forum* (USM AAUP message board) expressing the reservations of some about Bob Pierce, who was recently elevated by Saunders to VP of Advancement.<sup>2</sup>
