USM's 'Kaetsu Court'

USM public relations specialist Van Arnold introduced what some refer to as USM's "Kaetsu Court" via his 18-May-2010 press release on the relationship between USM and Japan's Kaetsu University. The relationship began, as Arnold explains, decades ago after former CoB economist Eddie Lewis, who is now with USM's cross-town rival William Carey University, visited Japan and developed close ties with KU officials. That relationship grew to provide the CoB with the *Kaetsu Distinguished Professorship in International Business*, though that title has had some curious holders throughout the years. Included among this curious group is current holder David Duhon, a professor of management who sources say does not hold any *real* IB credentials.
