Barry Babin



Johye Hwang

Like some others, Hwang made a nice jump – from USM to the University of Missouri.



The UM website does not offer much in the way of information on Hwang, who previously served in the CoB's tourism management department, so we are unable to report on her latest research endeavors.

Joy Kozar

Kozar made a nice jump (after 2005-06) – from USM to Kansas State University – where she is currently an assistant professor of apparel marketing. Kozar has been extremely busy. She currently has articles in press at the *Journal of Fashion Marketing and Management* and the *College Student Journal*. In 2007 she published an article in *The Learning Organization*, and in 2006 she had an article published in the *Family and Consumer Sciences Research Journal*.



Kozar also has two book chapters in press, as well as two in press articles with the *ITAA Proceedings*. She had two other articles published in the 2006 *ITAA Proceedings*. In her brief time at KSU, Kozar has already been awarded two grants.

While in Hattiesburg, Kozar was the co-owner of *Eve Marie's*.

Doowoo Nam

Nam left USM's business school in the early part of the period. He is now an assistant professor of finance at Inha University in Korea. Since his last evaluation at USM, Nam published an article on emerging stock markets in the *Journal of Emerging Market Finance*.

Commentary

Just this brief look alone shows just how devastating the CoB's turnover since 2003 has been. The junior faculty above carried with them future A- and B-level publications, and the potential for outstanding careers in their fields. The losses in tourism management, in particular, also show how harmful Cherylynn Becker's administration of that department was over the brief period she served as TM chair.
