Bryant, who sources believe was Saunders' preferred candidate in the 2011 election, also visited the USM campus on a variety of occasions. One of his more well-known visits came prior to Saunders becoming president, when Bryant served as commencement speaker and put forth the message that graduates should emulate heroes, such as Superman.

The question some are asking now concerns how Bryant felt about Saunders' <u>sudden</u> <u>decision to</u> "resign" a few days ago, on 27-April-2012. Bryant was noticeably absent at Saunders' press conference, which was attended by only Hank Bounds, the Mississippi IHL commissioner who <u>some believe</u> will succeed Saunders as president of USM, and Ed Blakeslee, the president of the IHL Board. Bryant's absence is further proof, to sources at least, that the machinery of government in Mississippi was, and is, fully

supportive of Saunders' departure from the USM president's office. Sources add that all that may remain now is to await the fallout from the ongoing scandal investigations to see just how bad things are on the Hattiesburg campus.
