Williams Professorship Now Occupied

CoB's Jennifer Sequeira Inaugural Holder of New Entrepreneurship Chair

The new *Alvin J. Williams Distinguished Professorship in Minority Entrepreneurship* has its inaugural holder in CoB associate professor of management Jennifer Sequeira. In receiving the title, Sequeira becomes the third *junior CoB professor* to hold a professorship, joining associate professor of marketing Michael Wittmann, who is the *Max Draughn Distinguished Professor of Healthcare Marketing*, and associate professor of management Fujun Lai, who is the *McCarty Distinguished Professor of MIS*. Sequeira was hired during the Harold Doty administration of the CoB (2003-07), after completing her PhD at the University of Texas – Arlington.

With the naming of Sequeira to this professorship, sources tell USMNEWS.net that the CoB rejoins a <u>previous trend</u> of elevating *current* CoB faculty to its available distinguished professorships. Examples of this <u>include</u> current CoB management chair David Duhon, <u>who was</u> (relatively) recently <u>named</u> the *Kaetsu Distinguished Professor of International Business*, and <u>many previous holders</u> of the *Morgan Distinguished Professorship in Accounting*. The only break in this <u>tradition</u> was the CoB's 2010 hiring of Michael Dugan from the University of Alabama <u>to hold the</u> *Horne Distinguished Professor in Accounting*.

Finally, sources tell USMNEWS.net that the Fall-2010 selection of Sequeira to hold the *Williams Professorship* only <u>heightens concern</u> over the current status of the CoB's *Parham Bridges Distinguished Professorship in Real Estate*, one that has gone unoccupied for a number of years. Despite <u>posting an ad</u> for the position in Nov-2009, the CoB has yet to hire for this important professorship. During previous years there was speculation, according to sources at least, that *Parham Bridges Professorship* funds were being used to support other, unrelated (and unadvertised) activities.
