Details from Niroomand's **Employee Travel Voucher** indicate that he is making an "academic visit" to Atlanta to collaborate on a research project. Investigators at usmpride.com were of the understanding that all of Niroomand's research work was with Ed Nissan, who is a professor in the CoB. There are no details about this so-called "collaborat[ive]" effort in Atlanta in the screen above.

What we do know is that the "academic visit" cost USM about \$250 in meals, and that Niroomand "stayed with relatives and friends."

During each "academic visit" that Niroomand makes to Atlanta, he seems to stack up a lot of miles within and around the city itself (314 miles in this instance). This is very curious. The total in this category is \$433.35 (see above).

Next we find that total expenses for this academic visit came to almost \$700, although EFIB chair Mark Klinedinst allowed a \$600 reimbursement (see below).
