The Face of CoB-GC Continues to Change


More New Faculty Sign Up for Duty

The faculty roster down at the CoB's Gulf Coast operation continues to twist and turn, as more new faculty are set to join in the coming weeks. The list now includes **Greg Bradley**, who is <u>classified</u> as a visiting assistant professor of <u>management</u> by USM-GC officials. According to sources, Bradley is co-owner of Decision Scientific in Gulfport, an applied research and management consulting firm. Like <u>Jamye Foster</u> and <u>Michael Gade</u>, Bradley's teaching duties begin in January of 2009.

Interestingly, Bradley is slated to teach two sections of <u>marketing</u> at the CoB-H site during the spring of 2009. These are:
