Thursday Nights in 'burg, Friday Mornings at USM to Change

If City of Hattiesburg and USM officials have their way, nightlife in Hattiesburg is going to change in the near future. In response to various night time episodes involving gunfire, a new group calling itself Town Gown is planning, among other things, to support a policy of administering drug tests to students on Friday mornings, presumably in an effort to curb Thursday night partying around the city. In response to this proposal, which will curb the Thursday partying habits of about two-fifths of those USM students who currently participate in such (according to *The Student Printz's* survey), USM student Kacie Bailey told *TSP* that such a blanket policy is unfair to students who do not use Thursday evening as a party night. Though nothing has been enacted to date, sources tell USMNEWS.net that major changes to Hattiesburg's night life are almost certainly coming in the weeks/months ahead.
