More Information on the Departure of Sean Salter

Information on the departure of former CoB assistant professor of finance Sean Salter continues to pour into USMNEWS.NET offices. This report covers two new items.

Salter Beats Doty to the Punch

Based on official documentation, USMNEWS.NET reporters have confirmed that former EFIB assistant professor Sean Salter agreed to terms offered by Middle Tennessee State University *before* being notified by former CoB Dean Harold Doty, and Doty's Associate Dean Farhang Niroomand, that he (Salter) would not be awarded a contract from USM after the 2007-08 academic year. In other words, when Doty and Niroomand met with Salter in the spring of 2007 to (gleefully) notify Salter that his (Salter's) future services were no longer desired, Salter had already sold his future services to MTSU.
