USM's Provost Search

USM is searching for a new provost. A reader sent the following email:

USM is in the middle of an intense search for a new Provost. Have you reviewed the credentials of the three candidates on the Provost web site? Do you have any opinions on which of these fine men [candidates] is the one to help end the troubles at USM? We await your comments with anticipation.

It's a bit much to offer recommendations or opinions based on just vitae, so we offer the following ideas about the three candidates as preliminary observations.

I'll start with a general (not universal) guiding principle or two.
