What does it cost to accommodate a bureaucrat's schedule?

Let's repeat that: it cost Mississippi taxpayers and USM students \$44,079.76 to "accommodate [a-soon-to-be-"retired"-or-"fired" Saunders'] schedule. AND, what was so important that Saunders had to spend \$44,079.76 for a flight from Norfolk to Gulfport?
